Know all men by this presents that we Fisiiah Osborn and William - Pennington of the County of McDonough and State of Illinois are held and firmly bound unto the people of the State of Illinois in the penal sum of Seven Hundred Dollars current money of the United States which payment well and truly to be made and performed we and each of us bind ourselves our heirs Executors and Administrators jointly severally and firmly by these presents:

Witness our hand and seals this 24th day of September A D 1838

The condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound Fisiiah ^{Osborn} Executrix of the last will and testament of William Osborn Deced do make or cause to be made a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the Goods and Chattels - Rights and credits lands tenements and hereditaments and the rents and proffits issuing out of the same of the said Deced which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said Fisiiah - Osborn or into the possession of any other person for her and the same so made do exhibit in the Court of Probate for the said County of McDonough as required by law

and also make and render a fair and
Just account of her actings and doings
as such Executrix to the said Court
when thereunto lawfully required
and to well and truly fulfil the
duties enjoined upon her in and
by the said Will; and shall more-
over pay or deliver to the persons
entitled thereto all the legacies
and bequests contained in said
will, so far as the estate of said
testator will thereunto extend
according to the value thereof and
as the law shall charge her, and
shall in general do and perform
all other acts which may from
time to time be required of
her by law, then this obligation
to be void otherwise to remain
in full force and virtue



Last Will of William Osborn decd

State of Illinois
 Mc Donough County ¹⁸⁶³ The people of the State of Illinois to all to whom these presents shall come Greeting: Know ye, that whereas William Osborn late of the County of Mc Donough and State of Illinois died on or about the fourteenth day of September A D 1863 as it is said after having duly made and published his last will and testament a copy whereof is herewith annexed leaving at the time of his death property in this State which may be lost destroyed or diminished in value if speedy care be not taken of the same: and inasmuch as it appears that Fisiak Osborn has been appointed executrix in and by said last will and testament to execute the same and to the end that said property may be preserved for those who shall appear to have a legal right or interest therein and that said will may be executed according to the request of said testator we do hereby authorize her the said Fisiak Osborn as such executrix to collect and secure all and singular the goods and Chattels rights and credits which were of said William Osborn at the time of his decease in whosoever hands or possession the same may be found in this State and well and truly to perform and fulfill all such duties as may be enjoined on her by said will so far as there may be property and the law charge here: and in general to do and perform all other acts which now are or hereafter may be required of her by law Witness Peachy R Gilmer Probate Justice of the Peace in and for said County of Mc Donough at his Office in Macomb this 24th day of September A D 1863

In the name of God Amen: I William Osborn of the County of Mc Donough and State of Illinois being weak in body but of sound mind and memory do make ordain and establish this to be my last will and testament hereby revoking all others and I do hereby appoint Fisiak Osborn to be the Executrix of this my last will and testament it is my will that all my just debts be paid that sufficient of my personal property be sold for that purpose after the payment of all my just debts and funeral expenses I do hereby devise & bequeath to my beloved wife all of my personal property during her natural life or widowhood to take the issue and profits thereof after her death or widowhood then afterwards the residue be equally divided to my heirs forever In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 6th day of April in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty six signed and acknowledged
