# Last Will of Hiram Osborn

In the name of God Amen

I Hiram Osborn of the County of Boone in the State of Indiana,

being of Sound Mind and Memory and considering the uncertainty of this frail life and transitory life do therefore make certain publick and declare this to be my last will and Testament that is to say after all my lawful debts are paid and discharged together with funeral expenses I bequeath the residue of my estate as follows: first to my beloved wife Hannah Osborn a sufficient of the rents and profits of my real estate to respectfully maintain her during her natural life to be seen to and provided for her by my executor herein named

Second I give and bequeath to my beloved son Napoleon Bonapart Osborn my real all the residue of my personal estate and my real estate being known except the rents as above bequeathed said real estate being known as the South West quarter and the West half of the South East quarter of the North East quarter of Section Thirty three in Township eighteen North of Range one West supposed to contain sixty acres and whereas this will does not recognize in it bequeath my other heirs or their children I hereby declare and publish that I have heretofore given and distributed to my other heirs certain amounts which I deemed all I was able or ever expected to give them therefore I bequeath them nothing of my present estate likewise I hereby make constitute and appoint William H. Clements to be executor of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made

In witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal this the first day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty seven

Shuley and Allen Bright two of the Subscribing witnesses to the within and foregoing last will and Testament of Hiram Osborn late of said County do advise personally appeared before Abram Miller Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas of Boone County in the State of Indiana and being duly sworn by the Clerk of said County upon their oaths declare and testify as follows that is to say that on the first day of April 1867 they saw the said Hiram Osborn sign his name to said instrument in writing as and for his last will and Testament and that these deponents at the same time heard the said Hiram Osborn declare the said instrument in writing to be his last will and Testament and that the said instrument in writing was at the same time at the request of the said Hiram Osborn and with his consent uttered and subscribed by said James W. Shuley & Allen Bright in the presence of said testator and in presence of each other as subscribing witnesses thereto and that the said Hiram Osborn was at the time of the signing and subscribing of said instrument in writing as aforesaid of full age that is more than twenty one years of age and of Sound Mind and Memory and not

under any coercion or restraint as the said deponents verily believe and further de-

Last will of Isaiah Lansday dec'd

In the name of God Amen.

Be it known that I Isaiah Lansday of the County of Borne and State of Indiana  
knowing the uncertainty of life, and being weak in body but of sound  
mind and memory, do make and publish this my last will and testament.

Revoking all others, Item 1<sup>st</sup> I give and devise to my daughter  
Eliza Harvins, one promissory note on Daniel Burden and A. W. Gossett  
calling for one thousand dollars with ten per cent interest payable semiannually,  
dated February 26, 1868 - Also one promissory note on John S. Herckey calling  
for ninety eight dollars with ten per cent interest payable semiannually,  
dated December 26, 1868. Also one promissory note on J. W. Harvins  
calling for fifty dollars with ten per cent interest dated January 1<sup>st</sup> 1869  
Also one promissory note on David H. Wilson for fourteen dollars and 50 cts  
with ten per cent interest. Dated December 26, 1868 executed to J. F.  
Herckey; And also one promissory note on John S. Green calling for  
ten dollars with ten per cent interest, dated July 7, 1868 - and also  
one promissory note on A. J. Barber for five dollars dated October  
21, 1867.

Item 2<sup>d</sup> I devise and bequeath to Eliza S. Herckey my grand daughter  
one two year old mare, also one small spring wagon and one set of harness  
also one feather bed and bedding and bedstead, also one large dining  
table, also one parlor stove, also one mantle clock and one stand  
table and also six chairs

Item 3<sup>d</sup> I devise and bequeath to my daughter Mary McVine  
one dollar, and to my son William Lansday one dollar. to be paid to
