State of Indiana. Hamilton County
 Phineas J. Osborn hereby bequeath, give and
~~devise~~ devise, all my lands, tenements, situated in
 the County of Hamilton and State of Indiana to
 my beloved wife Mary Ann, and, I also give & bequeath
 to her all my notes & accounts which I hold against
 persons residing in the States of Ohio & Indiana,
 subject however to my just debts, & funeral expenses
 these my said wife's to pay, and I further give &
 bequeath, all the property, which I own in the State
 of Ohio, to my daughter to her absolutely, clear of
 incumbrance. Witness my hand and seal this 30th
 of January 1858. Phineas J. Osborn. Seal
