Charles Osborn's Will.

Be it remembered that I, Charles Osborn of the County of Hendricks, in the state of Indiana do make and ordain on this the sixth day of the 7th month, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and seventy one, this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and making void all wills and testaments by me at any time heretofore made.

First. - I direct that all my just debts and funeral charges be paid out of the first monies of my estate, that shall come into the hands of my hereinafter appointed executor.

Second. - I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Annath Osborn all my real estate, to wit: seventy acres bought of Alfred Hunt; and forty-nine and one fourth acres bought of Benjamin Sheron all in sections thirty three T. 15 N. Range 2 West as described in the deed of purchase. And I also give and bequeath to my aforesaid wife all my personal estate that shall remain after paying all legal claims against the same; and all the bequests hereinafter named.

- Third. - I give and bequeath to my son Alpheus Osborn five dollars
- I give and bequeath to my son Leuchbert H. Osborn five dollars
- I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Osborn five dollars
- I give and bequeath to my daughter Hannah H. Osborn five dollars
- I give and bequeath to my daughter M. Sybil Osborn five dollars

And I hereby make, ordain and appoint my beloved wife Annath Osborn, and the said Alpheus Osborn and Leuchbert H. Osborn sole executors of this my last will and testament.

Wagnitt the other subscribing witnesses thereto and that they each attested the same, and subscribed their names as witnesses thereto, in the presence and at the request of said testator, and in the presence of each other
