Hardin Osborn Will

In the name of the benedict Father of All, I Hardin Osborn of Hendricks County State of Indiana, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament

I give and bequeath devise to my beloved wife, in lieu of her interest in my lands the farm on which we now reside, situate in the County of Hendricks and a state aforesaid, containing about one hundred and twenty acres, ~~until~~ ^{until} my youngest child (Susan O Osborn) arrives to the age of twenty one years, at which time it is my will that my said farm be sold except the dower right of my

but however, should she desire to sell her interest in said farm at that time it is my will that the whole of said farm be sold and that my wife have paid to her one third part of the proceeds thereof in cash for her own proper use and support, And further it is my will that my wife have for her own proper use all the stock, household goods furniture, provisions and other goods and chattles belonging to my estate at the time of my decease, she however ~~setting~~ ^{selling} so much thereof as may be sufficient to pay my just debts.

Item 2nd, It is further my will that my son Bennet Osborn have paid to him out of the proceeds of the sale of my farm three hundred ^{& thirty five} dollars in cash, together with the interest thereon from this date, it being money received of him by me while he was in U S Army, provided the same should not be paid by my wife before the sale of my farm.

It is further my will that my son James Osborn have paid to him out of the proceeds of the sale of my farm eighty dollars in cash together with the interest thereon from this date, it being money received of him by me while he was in the U S Army, provided the same shall not be paid by my wife before the sale of my farm.

Item 3rd It is further my will that after the payments aforesaid are made that all the remainder of the proceeds of the sale of my farm be equally divided between my lawfull heirs the heirs however of my son Jefferson Osborn deceased according to my estate for one hundred and four dollars & fifty cents together with the interest thereon from this date it being money heretofore paid by me for the benefit of my said son Jefferson.

Item 4th I do hereby nominate and appoint

my beloved wife guardian of all my minor children until they arrive at the age of twenty one years or until marry.

Item 5th It is further my will that there be no administrator, on this my last will and testament other than to have the same recorded in the proper offices for the record of such instruments.

I do hereby revoke all former wills by me made.

In testimony hereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 6th day of March in the year 1864. Hardin Osborn ^{and} signed and acknowledged by said Hardin Osborn as his last will and testament in our presence and signed by us in his presence

State of Indiana, Hendricks County ss, Before me Levi Ritter clerk of the court of Common Pleas of the County of Hendricks aforesaid personally came Amos S Wills one of the subscribing witnesses to the foregoing and hereto attached instrument of writing who being by me first duly sworn upon oath deposes and says that Hardin Osborn the testator named in said instrument of writing purporting to be his last Will and Testament did sign, seal, publish and declare the same to be his last will and Testament on the day of the date thereof, that the said testator was at the said time of the full age of twenty one years, and of sound and disposing mind and memory, and that he was not under coercion, compulsion or restraint and that he was competent to devise his property, And that the said testator as signed, sealed, published and declared the same to be his last Will and Testament in manner and form as aforesaid in the presence of affiant and of Leroy H Kennedy the other subscribing witness thereto, and that they each attested the same, and subscribed their names as witnesses thereto in the presence, and at the request of said testator and in the presence of each other
