This day Daniel Dyburn presented in open Court the last Will and Testament of John Dyburn Deceased and proved the same by the Affirmation of Joseph Hockett one of the subscribing Witnesses  
 Declared by the Court that ~~with~~ <sup>will</sup> be Recorded ~~whis~~ in the words following,

In the Name of God Amen  
 I John Dyburn of Clinton County and in this State for the distributions of such worldly Estate as it has pleased God to bless me with in this life do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in the following manner

- 1<sup>st</sup> it is my will that all my last debts and funeral Expenses be paid out of any estate
- 2<sup>nd</sup> I give to my son Daniel Dyburn and his heirs forever the sum of one dollar
- 3<sup>rd</sup> I give unto my daughter Ann Hershey and her heirs forever the sum of one dollar
- 4<sup>th</sup> I give to my daughter Sarah Way's heirs the sum of one dollar
- 5<sup>th</sup> I give to my daughter Wilda Way wife of Nathan Way and her heirs forever the sum of one dollar
- 6<sup>th</sup> I give to my son John Dyburn and his heirs forever one three year old mare and one hundred acres of land it being a part of the Southeast 1/4 of Section Numbered 8 in Township 20 N R 14 W of the Range 14 East of the 2<sup>d</sup> principal meridian in the District of lands offered for sale at Cincinnati which lot or 1/4 section contains 160 acres to be the South part of said 1/4 section dividing the land by an east and west line
- 7<sup>th</sup> I give to my son Jonathan Dyburn and his heirs forever the Remaining part of the said 1/4 section of land by his paying of <sup>dollars</sup>

6<sup>th</sup> I give to my daughter Mary Ballard and  
her heirs forever the sum of one dollar —

9<sup>th</sup> I give to my daughter Susannah Byburn  
and her heirs forever the one cow and ten 10  
dollars

10<sup>th</sup> I give to my daughter Elizabeth Byburn  
and her heirs forever one cow and 10 dollars

11<sup>th</sup> I do give and bequeath to my beloved wife  
Sarah Byburn all any moveable property  
for her to have the use of them during her  
widowhood and then to Return them to my  
son John except her wheel and bed thereto  
be his own Right and property forever also  
to have peaceable possession on the south part  
of the afforeid land with support during her  
widowhood

and lastly I constitute my beloved wife  
Sarah Byburn and my son Daniel Byburn  
of this County and State Executors and Execu-  
tors of this my last will and testament and I  
do hereby utterly revoke and annul  
all former wills and testaments by me in any  
manner made ratifying this and no other  
to be my last will and testament in testimony  
whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal  
this 19<sup>th</sup> day of the 5<sup>th</sup> month 1816.
