Alonzo Osborn's Will.

Record of the last will and testament of Alonzo Osborn filed and proved in open court January 23^d 1862

I Alonzo Osborn of Wayne County and State of Indiana do make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking and making void all former wills by me at any time heretofore made.

1st. I direct that my body be decently interred and that my funeral be conducted in a manner corresponding with my estate and situation in life. and as to such worldly estate as it has pleased God to entrust me with I dispose of the same in the following manner to wit. I direct first that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid as soon after my decease as possible out of the first money that shall come into the hands of my executors from any portion of my estate real or personal.

After the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses as above directed I then give and bequeath to my sister Emeline Osborn my farm situate in Wayne County and State of Indiana containing about One hundred acres during her natural life and all the stock household goods furniture notes and book accounts pro.

visions and other goods and chattels which may belong to me at the time of my decease during her natural life as aforesaid she however permitting my executor to sell as much thereof as may be sufficient to pay my just debts and funeral expenses as before directed. If my personal property shall be insufficient for the support of my sister Emeline during her natural life I direct that my executor shall sell so much of my real-estate as may be necessary to give her a good comfortable and sufficient support during her natural life and to effectuate this my intention I hereby vest my executor with full power and authority to dispose of so much of my real-estate as may be necessary for her support in fee simple or for a term of years or otherwise as he may think proper and deeds to purchasers to execute acknowledg and deliver in as full and ample a manner in every respect as I could myself do if I were living.

After the decease of my sister Emeline I direct that a good and substantial stone fence be erected so as to inclose the graves of myself and relatives who are or may be between this and that time entered in the burying ground known as "Little Oak Horn" burying ground and the expenses of the same to be paid out of my estate which may be left at her death.

From my estate which may be left after my Emeline's decease I direct that the sum of Three hundred dollars be given to my nephew Monzo Osborn (Chatfield Osborn's son) and a like sum of Three hundred dollars be given to my nephew Jacobiah Osborn (Daniel Osborn's son).

After the death of my sister Emeline and the payment of the expenses and legacies above mentioned I direct that the residue and remainder of my estate which may be left be equally divided as soon as it can be done share and share alike amongst and between my brother Samuel Osborn my Sister Jane Butter and Nellie Osborn being three shares which I design shall be equal.

And I hereby make and ordain my worthy and well-loved friend George Hunt of Union County and State of Indiana executor of this my last will and testament.
