In the name of God amen I Thomas Clyburn of Washington County & State of Kentucky being informed of my lot of perfect & sound memory thanks be to God for it and calling to mind the uncertainty of this life knowing that it is appointed for all men once dead do make and constitute this my last will and Testament in the manner and form following "1815" First I recommend my soul in the hands of God that gave it and hoping through the merits of my blessed Saviour and

I desire Jesus Christ to receive the same again at the
 general resurrection and my body to the earth to be bu-
 ried in decent form according to the direction of my exe-
 cutas hereafter named. Secondly I give and bequeath unto
 my beloved wife Persilla the Tract of Land I now live on
 it being purchased from Scott Rice & Helm containing
 three hundred and fifty five acres more or less unto her du-
 ring her natural life it is also my will & desire that my
 two daughters Elizabeth and Susy is to have a home and
 maintained on said land during their single life also
 I give unto my wife my negro man Isaac and my negro
 woman Hannah during her life also my race horse my
 Bay mare black faced my old mare and my grey horse
 called Jimmy now of my old friend more has a colt not
 shamed and should raise it it is my will and desire my son
 Joseph should have it if she should feel having a colt not
 shamed to raise the same for him to have my last Springs Bay
 horse colt, I likewise give unto my wife one Bed Bed Stee &
 furnished the Cream & Geor & all the rest of my household
 furnished the rest of my Bed and other and furnished belonging
 to them excepted also three cows and calves choice. Ten head
 of Sheep choice. Thirty three of hogs choice my cart and ox-
 en and Log chain two hand saws ploughs one shod plough
 Geors for two horses double saws and three axes three hoes
 two wedges two augers and hand saw and mallet all the
 cloth not made up spun yarn, Cotton wool & Flax raw
 half the killing hogs in the pen to kill before the thirty
 before mentioned but if the meat should be killed before I
 departed this life she is to have half of the meat also my
 crop of corn by me, except one crib of corn at the barn which
 is to be divided under a contract made with my sons like-
 wise all the wheat in the barn not thrashed out all the
 flour by Geor & her hogs &c. and my share my wheat flour
 & Geor unto her during her natural life also I leave unto
 my wife forty Dollars to be paid her in five years after I
 my heirs gets possession of the land purchased of Lockhart
 Geor to enable her to school her small children. I also
 give unto my son Edward a Tract of Land on the Rowling fork
 which I purchased of Jere. Beuchamp but my son Edward
 is to pay my Estate Two hundred and twenty six Dollars in
 three years after possession is got of the land purchased
 of Lockhart Geor I also give to Edward one Bed Stee & fur-
 nished one cow and four and a half Dollars worth of Poles
 I also give unto my son Thomas all the Land I purchased
 of Lockhart Geor on these conditions my son Edward is to
 have half the use of the above named plantation purchased
 of said Lockhart and also half the use my Stills and ap-
 paratus for three years after possession is got of said land
 to enable the said Edward to pay the above named Sums
 to my estate considering his Land on the Rowling fork
 which I left him to be worth that Sum more than

I have already give to my sons Walter & William. Thomas is to have the other half of the land as soon as possession with Edward and half of the use of the Mills & with Edward the three years. now after Edward land is out Thomas is to have the land altogether with its appurtenances to the Mills for two years more. my son Thomas is to pay my estate the sum of seven hundred and sixty Dollars in five years after possession is got of said land purchased of Lockhart Eagan I also leave unto my son Thomas one Bed Ste Bed & Furniture one cow four and a half Dollars worth of pewter and my new great Coat I also give unto my daughter Catharine Carver my negro Girl Mally also sixty Dollars to be paid her in five years after possession is got of the land purchased from said Lockhart Eagan also to my daughter Sarah Montgomery my negro Girl Mary also one cow fifty Dollars to be paid her the time above mentioned to Catharine also to my daughter Palsey Caimron my negro Boy named Felix also one hundred Dollars to be paid as above. I also give unto my Daughter Anne Smith my negro Girl Charity also one hundred and twenty five Dollars to be paid as above also to my Daughter Elizabeth my negro Boy Joseph likewise my sword two year old Colt nine shillings Bed Ste Bed and furniture one cow four and a half Dollars worth of pewter also woman saddle and fifty dollars to be paid as above also I give unto my Daughter Treacy my negro woman Anne and her increase hereafter one cow and year old Colt next Spring a Boy more nine shillings Bed Ste Bed and furniture four & half Dollars worth of Pewter. Likewise I leave unto my son Joseph after his mothers death the Tracts of land above described to his mother with every appurtenances belonging thereto also a Bed Ste Bed and Furniture one cow four and a half Dollars worth of Pewter and all the rest of my old est clothes except my old hat It is my wish and desire my negro man Isaac shall have that New Stear and my son Walter two hundred and twenty seven Dollars likewise to my son William one hundred Dollars to be paid them at the time described for my Daughters to receive their money with to them to make their lands equal with the rest of my sons, also I leave unto my son William one Bed Ste Bed & Furniture one cow four and a half Dollars worth of pewter also the plough & Gear he has of mine in his possession I also leave unto my three Grandchildren Thomas Blount son of William and Martin children of Cecilia Blount son of my daughter Mary two hundred and fifty Dollars to be paid them at the time above described to pay for my to some of my daughters Walter & William. also I desire that my young man to receive immediately after death to be equally divided among them. It is my desire that if I do not see my two negro men Charles & William before I die that my executors hereafter named shall see them to make payments for the land I purchased from

Lockport. Eager also collect what money is due me from former contract and for wheat engaged and apply the money for the same use & so much of it as will pay the contract and the balance to go to my estate. Make care to the Rev. Edward Foxworth that he care for burial expenses & also twenty dollars to be given to the poor discretionary with my Executors. The residue of my estate not will'd away by me and the whiskey which will be made under a contract made with my sons to be sold and equally divided amongst all my children above named including my Grand children above named to have a child's part and after the death of my wife what I have left her and not will'd away to be equally divided as above and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Walter C. Eager and William to be my Executors to this my last will and testament reaching all other wills made by me in writing wheresoever I have heretofore set my hand & affix at my said this first day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & fifteen.
