In the name of God Amen I Walter B. Courm of the County of  
 Washington and State of Virginia being infirm of body of  
 perfect and sound memory and mind thanks be to God for it  
 and calling to mind the uncertainty of this life do make  
 and constitute this my Last Will & Testament in the presence  
 and firm following viz first I recommend my soul to God  
 in the hands of God that I have it to me hoping that through  
 the merits of my Saviour Jesus Christ to receive the same  
 against the General Resurrection and my body to the ground  
 to be buried in decent form according to the directions  
 of my Executors hereafter named. Item 1<sup>st</sup> I give and bequeath  
 unto my beloved wife Charlotte all my Land Estate Being

purchased of Thomas Osborne Esqr and Thomas Combs  
 containing two hundred and forty three acres more or less  
 also a tract or parcel of land purchased of Charles Burks  
 containing thirty acres being apart & litters Survey I also  
 give and bequeath unto my wife Charlotte my negro man  
 Moses my negro woman Nancy my negro woman Betty  
 my negro woman Teary my negro Boy Ben and my  
 negro Boy Tom I also give and bequeath unto my wife  
 Charlotte all my house hold and kitchen furniture my  
 new wagon and all my gear three carry plows all my  
 hoes of such kind every kind my log chain all my axes and  
 wedges all my shovel plows and as many double and  
 single trees and chisels and other apparatus as will suffice  
 for the use of the aforesaid places I also give and bequeath  
 unto my wife Charlotte all my Cooper Tools  
 namely hand saw Cooper adze drawing knife Iron Auger  
 Jointed Compass &c I also give and bequeath unto my wife  
 Charlotte my old Bay mare called Jan my Bay horse  
 called Charles my big sorrel mare called Queen my  
 little sorrel mare called Kit my young bay mare called pat  
 and my young sorrel horse called Mithra I also give and  
 bequeath unto my wife Charlotte all my stock of Hogs &  
 Cattle or so many of them as my Executors may see cause  
 to have unsold. I also give and bequeath unto my wife  
 Charlotte all my stock of sheep all my poultry of every  
 kind all my corn wheat and Rye all my flour Gats Hay  
 fodder & and after complying with this my last will and  
 Testament I have and to hold the aforesaid property dur-  
 ing her single life and if she should marry it to  
 my will that I shall have but one third part of my  
 property Item 2<sup>d</sup> I give and bequeath unto my son Pias  
 two hundred dollars in round silver together with what  
 I have gave him before to be paid him twelve months hence  
 Item 3<sup>d</sup> I also give and bequeath unto my Daughter Lavinia  
 Johnson together with what I have of my negro Gul Harriet  
 appraised to two hundred dollars together with what I have  
 gave her before Item 4<sup>d</sup> I also give and bequeath to my  
 son Francis two hundred Dollars in round silver to be paid him  
 twelve months hence also one cow and calf one bed and Furniture  
 together with what I have gave him before his bed and cow  
 is to be paid him when he marries or house keeps Item 5<sup>d</sup> I also  
 give and bequeath unto my Daughter Caroline my negro boy

Ralph appraised to one hundred dollars also to one hundred dollars  
in round silver one horse and bridle one cow and calf one bed and  
furniture to get her with what I have given her to be paid her when  
she arrives to the age of twenty one years or marriage. Item 6<sup>th</sup> I  
also give and bequeath unto my son Edward two hundred dollars  
in round silver also my young Sorrel horse called Tom one cow  
and calf one bed and furniture together with what I have given  
him to be paid when he arrives to the age of twenty one years  
Item 7<sup>th</sup> I also give and bequeath unto my son Thomas two hundred  
dollars round silver one horse a black or dark Sorrel one cow  
and calf one bed and furniture one bridle and saddle to be paid  
him when he arrives to the age of twenty one years Item 8<sup>th</sup>  
I also give and bequeath unto my son William two hundred  
dollars in round silver one horse saddle and bridle one cow and  
calf one bed and furniture to be paid him when he arrives  
to the age of twenty one years Item 9<sup>th</sup> I also give and bequeath  
unto my daughter Teresa two hundred dollars in silver or a  
if they should be any that my Executors should think necessary to  
have valued to her in place of the <sup>two</sup> hundred dollars also one  
horse saddle and bridle one cow and calf one bed and furniture  
to be paid her when she arrives to the age of twenty one years or  
marriage Item 10<sup>th</sup> I also give and bequeath unto my son Henry  
two hundred dollars in round silver also one horse saddle and  
bridle one cow and calf one bed and furniture to be paid him  
when he arrives at the age of twenty one years Item 11 I also give  
and bequeath unto my daughter Priscilla two hundred dollars in  
round silver or a negro if there should be any that my Executors  
should think necessary to have valued to her in place of the said two  
hundred dollars also one horse saddle and bridle one cow and calf  
one bed and furniture to be paid her when she arrives to the age  
of twenty one years or marriage Item 12<sup>th</sup> I also give and bequeath  
unto my daughter Elizabeth two hundred dollars in round silver  
or a negro if my Executors should think necessary to have one valued  
to her in the place of the aforesaid two hundred dollars also one horse  
saddle and bridle one cow and calf one bed and furniture to be  
paid her when she arrives at the age of twenty one years or  
marriage It is my will and desire that my Executors shall at  
their option hire or sell my negro man Gustavus when and  
where they think most suitable It is also my will and  
desire that all my property not yet willed away shall  
be sold and the money for said negro and the residue of my  
property shall be left to the freedom of Executors discretion of as they
