Cooney of the County of Pennsylvania and State of the other part Witnesseth That for and in consideration of the sum of seven hundred dollars of lawful Money of the United States to have the said Jacob Haughton in hand well and truly paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Jacob Haughton that he granted Bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant Bargain and sell unto the said Michael Brown and Samuel Cooney their heirs and assigns all the following described goods and Chattels Viz One Still said to contain One Gallon hundred and eighty Gallons without a Cap for two year Old Whiskey One year Old Whiskey two bay Horses One black Horse One grey mare ten Shuck four beds and bedding six Salt Sticks three Smaller Sticks One Cupboard One Sore and a Backlin all the Kitchen Furniture belonging to the said Jacob Haughton One Crop but saw One Stack of Wheat and Corn in the Ground to have & to hold all and singular the above mentioned and described Goods and Chattels and every part and parcel thereof unto the said Michael Brown and Samuel Cooney their heirs and assigns forever
