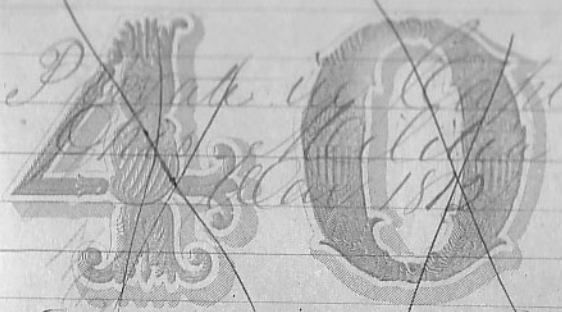

That he did not receive a written discharge that he has applied for and rec'd Land Warrant No 73.254 - herein enclosed, under the act of Sept 28 1830 for the services aforesaid - and there is now due him 120 acres more - he herein enclose his said Warrant and with it he claims 160 acres - for his said services

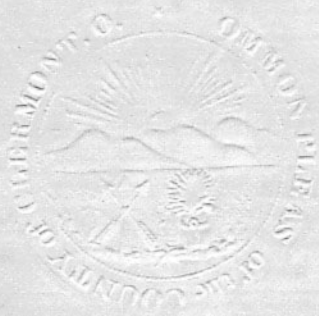

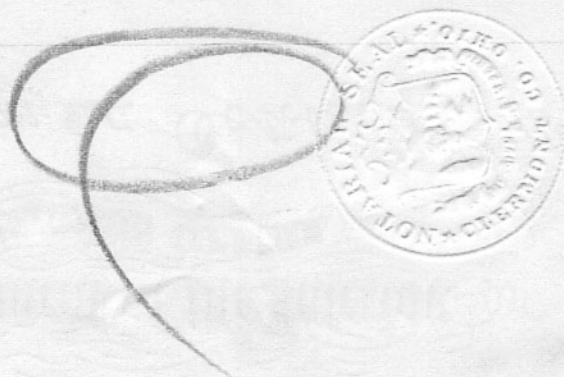

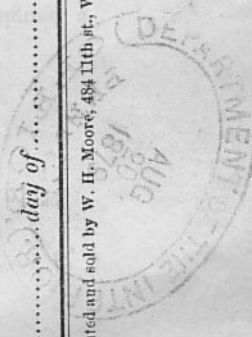
