D., one thousand eight hundred and seventy one personally appeared before me Jos Perkins Clerkof the County Court a court of record within and for the county and Stateaforesaid John W Ogburn aged Eighty five years, aresident of _____, County of Williamson, State ofTennessee, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is✓ married; that his wife's name was May Turner to whom hewas married at Fayetteville Lincoln Co, Tenn the 14 day of July1814 that he served the full period of sixty days in the Military service ofthe United States in the war of 1812; that he is the identical John W Ogburnwho aspirant in Captain John Portercompany, Col Myrre regiment, Genl Roberts brigade, Genl Jacksondivision, at Fayetteville on the _____ day of September 1812, andwas honorably discharged at Fayetteville on the _____ day of December1812; that his discharge has been lost or mislaid

that he, at no time during the late rebellion against the authority of the United States, adhered to the cause of the enemies of the Government, giving them aid or comfort, or exercised the functions of any office whatever under any authority, or pretended authority, in hostility to the United States; and that he will support the Constitution of the United States: that he is not in receipt of a pension under any previous Act; that he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension roll of the United States, under the provision of the Act approved February 14, 1871; and he hereby constitutes and appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation P to

D. one thousand eight hundred and fifty five personally appeared before me a Justice of the peace within and for the County and State aforesaid John W Oylburn aged about sixty nine years Resident of Williamson County in the State of Tennessee who being duly sworn according to law declares that he is the identical John W Oylburn who was private in the company commanded by Captain William Wilson and was attached to the company commanded by Captain John Porter at Fort Stather in the Regiment of Tennessee Volunteers commanded by Col Winn in the war with Great Britain declared by the United States on the 18th day of June 1832 for the term of three months and continued in actual service in said war for fourteen days that he has heretofore made application for County land under the act of September 28. 1830 and received a land warrant no- for forty acres which he has since legally disposed of and cannot now return he makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the additional County land to which he may be entitled under the act approved the 30 day of March 1835. He also declares that he has

never applied for nor received
under this or any other act of congress
any bounty land warrant except the
one above mentioned for so long
